


## ~Natural Heritage Award~ The Credits 2018 Nominations



### Cloverleaf Garden Club

The **Cloverleaf Garden Club** has fostered pride and promoted the beautification of Mississauga's neighbourhoods for 74 years (1944). They have a long distinguished history and are well known for bringing horticulture and gardening knowledge to hundreds of people in the community, through monthly meetings, guest speakers, annual plant sales and annual garden tours. Cloverleaf donates funds and oversees students work, planting garden beds and supports The Compass Food Bank in partnership with EcoSource providing fresh vegetables to needy clients.



### Dave Taylor

**Dave** has been a Teacher, Consultant, Author, and Award-Winning Photographer, focusing on the importance of natural heritage in Mississauga for many years. As Education Director with The Riverwood Conservancy (TRC) he created [Discovery@Riverwood](mailto:Discovery@Riverwood), a series of free educational workshops, walks and lectures on natural heritage topics and over 50,000 Mississaugans have attended these events. He has also published numerous books, eBooks, and he has created videos and published photos where people can learn about Mississauga's natural heritage and history.



## Nicky Hall

**Nicky** has been a fierce advocate for conserving the natural life and beauty of Meadowvale for decades. With the help of Ward 9 Councillor Pat Saito she formed a group called Friends of Lake Wabukayne in 2008, which is still going strong today. She is renowned for rescuing animals from oil spills, installing a butterfly garden, a canoe garden, a bee hotel, and organizing community events to promote public awareness of parks and its wildlife.



## Many Feathers

**Many Feathers** is a non-profit based in Mississauga with numerous projects to promote food sustainability and environmental awareness. The Many Feathers Market is a growing farmers' market located at the Lisgar GO Station, which was launched in 2015 and features live music, food trucks, local artists and entrepreneurs, Ontario farmers, and educational workshops. The Many Feathers Garden Project is a collaborative and educational endeavour that aims to develop a hub of urban agriculture, while engaging with the community to provide access to locally grown organic produce.
